Participants must be registered with the Parks and Recreation office to use the online service. Online registrations are processed in real time. A confirmation can be printed at the end of the online process. This is highly recommended as this will serve as notice for you to attend on the specific start date. You will not be able to attend if your name is not on the class/activity roster. If you did not receive a confirmation prior to your class/activity, call (520) 421-8677 or e-mail us at parkscreg@casagrandeaz.gov.

NOTE: WHEN A CLASS SESSION OCCURS OVER A HOLIDAY, THERE WILL BE NO CLASS ON THAT PARTICULAR DAY. (CHRISTMAS DECEMBER 25, NEW YEAR'S DAY JANUARY 1, MLK DAY JANUARY 20, AND PRESIDENTS' DAY FEBRUARY 17).

3. Dropped off registrations **DO NOT** receive priority over mail-in registrations. All registration received prior to the registration date (December 17, 2013) will be mixed together and randomly selected for processing.
4. We make every attempt to satisfy your request, but cannot guarantee placement. All classes and activities are subject to change depending upon instructor availability and minimum/maximum enrollment and are subject to cancellation due to insufficient enrollment.

EVERGREEN AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Monday - Friday (Afterschool – 6:00 pm)

The City of Casa Grande Parks and Recreation is sponsoring an after school program for grades K-5 at Evergreen Elementary School. The program will run from school dismissal until 6:00 p.m. Activities for this program include sports, games, homework time, arts and crafts and much more. Transportation to the programs is provided by the school district. Parents must make bussing arrangements with their child's school. Transportation from the program is not provided. Space is limited to 90, and registration will be taken on a first come, first serve basis. Registration forms are available at the Parks & Recreation Office.

WEEKLY PROGRAM FEES

5 days – \$40 (1st child), \$36 each additional child
4 days – \$36 (1st child), \$32.40 each additional child

2 days – \$18 (1st child), \$16.20 each additional child
1 day – \$9 (1st child), \$8.10 each additional child

This program has been made possible by the City of Casa Grande, Casa Grande Elementary School District and the Department of Economic Security.

Summer Club for Kids

The City of Casa Grande Parks and Recreation Department will sponsor a supervised summer recreation program for 5-12 years olds (12 year olds must be entering the 6th grade in the fall). Participants are free to arrive and depart the program at any time during the program hours. This program will run Tuesday, May 27 until one week prior to the start of the next school year from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Breakfast and lunch are available most days and a nutritious snack will be served each day. Activities include sports, games, cooking, arts and crafts and much more. Each week will include a field trip that will have a separate charge of \$5.00. A \$40 registration fee is required per child (\$80 maximum per family). The registration fee is \$35 (\$70 maximum per family) for those currently registered in the Evergreen After School Program. All fees must be prepaid for each week.

Space is limited and registration will be taken on a first come, first serve basis.

The A.S.K.C. is a supervised drop-in program for school age youth ages 5-17. All participants must register and submit a registration fee of \$10.00. More than three late pick up(s) within a 30-day period will result in your child/children being dropped from the program.

BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES:

Children are expected to follow the rules and directions of staff. Expected behavior will be taught and positively reinforced. Negative consequences will result if a child displays unacceptable behavior. A negative consequence could include a time-out, temporary suspension and/or removal from the program.

DANCE CLASSES FOR YOUTH

If the class does not state Adult/Child, parents are asked to remain outside the classroom area. Our instructors have found the quality of instruction has often been affected by parent and/or sibling distractions, interruptions and various other concerns, which interfere with class instruction. We also feel it is most beneficial for children to have recreational time interacting with their peers. One to two "room parents" may stay, if needed, to assist with restroom breaks, helping with any one-on-one interaction, etc., but they may not help with the instruction.

Classes will begin the week of January 27 and continue for 12 weeks.

No classes will be held during President's Day (February 17) and Spring Break (March 17 - 21).

Some classes will hold a recital at the end of the session, May 2014, exact date to be announced. Costume fittings will be done during the first class in January. Fee for the costume is included in the class fee. **CHILDREN MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE AT THIS CLASS IN ORDER TO BE ASSURED OF THEIR COSTUME ARRIVING ON TIME.**

(COSTUMES TAKE APPROXIMATELY 12 WEEKS TO ARRIVE SO IT IS IMPERATIVE YOUR CHILD IS AT THE FIRST CLASS FOR THEIR COSTUME FITTING.)





The Senior Meals and transportation programs are a collaborative effort funded by Pinal-Gila Council for Senior Citizens - Area Agency on Aging, United Way of Pinal County, Older Americans Act, and the City of Casa Grande.

RIDER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (RAP)

Mileage Reimbursement is a program for Casa Grande residents who are 60 years of age or older or 18 years of age or older with a disability (proof of disability required) who rely on relatives, friends, or neighbors for transportation. Mileage is paid to the RAP participant at 50 cents per mile for the purpose of reimbursing their chosen driver for providing transportation services. RAP does not provide drivers. Approved RAP travel within Casa Grande will be reimbursed with a maximum of 300 miles for individuals and 400 miles for married couples per calendar month. Out of town travel must be pre-approved and is only authorized for medical reasons.

The Rider Assistance Program is a collaborative effort funded by the State of Arizona LTAF II and the City of Casa Grande. Continuation of the program is dependent upon future funding.
