Answer:

- Most recent tax return (1040 form)

What if I don't feel comfortable sharing my income?

Answer:

We understand privacy is important. Income verification is now required to determine eligibility for the new scholarship structure, but all information will be kept strictly confidential and only used for scholarship purposes. We only require income (normally on line 11) and the list of dependents. All other information like social security numbers can be blacked out.

What are the income thresholds for the 20% and 40% discounts?

Answer:

We'll be using income brackets based on household size, similar to federal assistance guidelines.

If I already received a scholarship this year, do I need to reapply under the new system?

Answer:

Yes, all families will need to provide income verification starting April 28th to be considered for the new 2-year scholarship program, regardless of any current scholarship.

What if I miss the April 28th, 2025 start date—can I still apply later?

Answer:

Absolutely. April 28th is just the first day we're accepting applications under the new system. You can come in any time after that to apply.



What happens after the 2 years? Will I have to reapply?

Answer:

Yes, after the 2-year period, you'll need to show updated income information to determine continued eligibility.

Can I apply online or do I have to come in person?

Answer:

At this time, income verification must be done in person at the CRC so we can securely review documentation and answer any questions you may have
