FLOCK CAMERA SYSTEM PROGRAM

The Casa Grande Police Department uses the FLOCK camera system as a powerful crime-fighting tool by capturing license plate data and vehicle details in real time. These cameras help identify stolen vehicles, track suspects, and provide critical leads in investigations. By alerting officers to wanted or flagged vehicles as they enter an area, FLOCK systems enhance situational awareness and enable faster, more targeted responses, ultimately helping to prevent and solve crimes more efficiently.

OPERATION SAVE A CASING

Operation Save-A-Casing is a Casa Grande Police Department program that allows responsible gun owners to help law enforcement combat firearm-related crime. Participation is completely voluntary; however, we encourage gun owners in our community to take part in reducing violent crime involving firearms. There is no cost, and the envelopes are available at the Casa Grande Police Department at 373 East Val Vista Boulevard.

DOCU PET

The Casa Grande Animal Care & Adoption offers the new online licensing platform that makes it easier for pet owners to register their pets and includes free access to DocuPet's HomeSafe® 24/7 lost pet service, helping reunite lost pets with their families and reducing shelter intakes.

Pet owners can register online, choose from a variety of custom pet tags, and each tag includes a unique code linked to the pet's secure online profile. If a pet goes missing, owners can quickly submit a Lost Pet Report, while anyone who finds a lost pet can file a Found Pet Report, improving the chances of a fast reunion. COMING SOON | URBAN CAMPING ORDINANCE ON PUBLIC PROPERTY

The City of Casa Grande has adopted an Urban Camping Ordinance to help protect the safety, cleanliness, and accessibility of parks, sidewalks, and other public spaces. In recent months, urban camping has led to growing health and safety concerns, including hazardous conditions such as human waste, discarded needles, and blocked access points, affecting city employees, pedestrians, and park visitors. The ordinance responds to numerous public complaints and emphasizes that shared spaces must remain clean, safe, and open for the entire community to enjoy. The city is taking a balanced approach—combining enforcement with efforts to connect individuals experiencing homelessness to support services. This ordinance is focused on preserving quality of life, not criminalizing homelessness. Unless contested, the ordinance will take effect on October 1, 2025.

COMING SOON | SHARED CUSTOMER WATER SERVICE DISCONNECTION AGREEMENT

This agreement would allow the City of Casa Grande to request that Arizona Water Company (AWC) disconnect water service for customers who are over 90 days past due on their sewer bills and refuse to pay. Before any disconnection, the City would provide mailed and posted notices at least 10 days in advance. Water service will remain off until the customer pays the amount due or enters a payment plan. The goal of this agreement is to prevent rate increases for customers that do pay their bills and maintain the sustainability of utility services. The agreement still needs to be finalized with AWC before being approved by the Arizona Corporation Commission, with implementation expected in approximately mid-2026.
